#### **Application Requirements**

#### To apply you must:

- Be a graduate of an ASHP-Accredited PGY1 Residency Program
- Be a licensed pharmacist in any state
- Adhere to the rules of the resident matching program process
- Be available for a virtual interview

Applicants must submit their application materials using PhORCAS, the Pharmacy Online Residency Centralized Application Service. Mailed or emailed applications will NOT be accepted.



#### Applications must include:

- Letter of intent
- Curriculum vitae
- Three letters of recommendation using the standardized reference form in PhORCAS
- Official transcript

# **PGY2 Geriatric Pharmacy Residency at VA Connecticut**

## **FACILITY OVERVIEW**



The VA Connecticut (VACT) Healthcare System serves more than 50,000 veterans who reside in Connecticut and Southern New England. VACT provides primary, secondary, and tertiary care in medicine, geriatrics, neurology, psychiatry, surgery, and other specialty

areas. As part of the VA New England Healthcare System, VACT is comprised of an inpatient facility in West Haven and two ambulatory care centers in West Haven and Newington, as well as six primary care Community Based Outpatient Clinics (CBOCs) located in outlying areas of the state in Danbury, New London, Orange, Stamford, Waterbury, Willimantic, and Winsted. The West Haven Campus has a 150-bed hospital, providing acute medical, surgical, and psychiatric care. The Newington Campus is a center for ambulatory care and diagnostic procedures. The CBOC's provide Primary Care to veterans in outlying parts of the state. VACT conducts research in psychiatry, oncology, medicine, surgery, neurology, and related basic sciences.

Major affiliations include the Yale University School of Medicine, the University of Connecticut School of Medicine and School of Dentistry. VACT is also affiliated with the University of Connecticut (UConn), University of St. Joseph (USJ), Western New England University (WNEU), and the University of Rhode Island (URI) Schools of Pharmacy.

VACT currently has 6 PGY1 Pharmacy Residents, 1 PGY2 Geriatric Pharmacy Resident, and 1 PGY2 Psychiatric Pharmacy Resident.



## ABOUT OUR PROGRAM

The purpose of the PGY2 Geriatric Pharmacy Residency at VACT is to develop a pharmacy practitioner with the knowledge and skills necessary to manage the complex care needs for older individuals throughout the healthcare continuum. The primary focus of the residency is to provide training on geriatric pharmacy management principles. In addition, the resident will also gain experience in managing important functional, behavioral, and social determinants common in older adults. The pharmacy resident will train in a variety of settings including home based primary care, ambulatory care, acute care, and community living center. Upon completion of the PGY2 Geriatric Pharmacy Residency, the pharmacy resident will be aualified to become board certified in geriatric pharmacy and to practice independently as a aeriatric pharmacist.

#### **Benefits**

The residency program begins July 1<sup>st</sup> of the current year and ends June 30<sup>th</sup> of the subsequent year. VACT Healthcare System will hire the resident as a 1-year term employee entitled to the following benefits:

## **RESIDENCY STRUCTURE**

VACT has a diverse and highly trained clinical pharmacy staff, including multiple Board Certified Geriatric Pharmacists (BCGP). Clinical Pharmacist Practitioners (CPP) have a scope of practice that allows for prescriptive authority. The variety of geriatric opportunities will allow for a well rounded experience and can be targeted to the residents specific interests.

# **GERIATRIC PHARMACY AT VACT**

<u>Geriatric Consult Service</u>: Focuses on the care of geriatrics patients in both an inpatient and outpatient setting for geriatrics-related concerns.

<u>Community Living Center (CLC)</u>: The CLC is an inpatient unit that specializes in long term care, rehabilitation, respite and hospice/palliative care.

<u>Home Based Primary Care (HBPC)</u>: HBPC provides comprehensive, interdisciplinary, primary care for homebound patients with complex medical, social, and behavioral conditions for whom routine clinic-based care is not feasible.

<u>Geropsychiatry</u>: Geropsychiatry provides psychiatric care to a broad range of older veterans.

<u>Hospice/Palliative Care:</u> Hospice/Palliative Care provides treatment that relieves suffering and helps to control symptoms in a way that respects personal, cultural, and religious beliefs and practices.
