PENSACOLA VA CLINIC

The Pensacola VA Clinic is a multi-specialty clinic within the Gulf Coast Veterans Health Care System which is part of the South Central VA Health Care Network of VISN 16. Our clinic is located in Pensacola, Florida on the west side of the city, adjacent to the Pensacola Naval Hospital. The main hospital is within a two hour drive in Biloxi, Mississippi and is a tertiary care teaching hospital providing a full range of patient care services. RESIDENCY PROGRAM

The purpose of the Gulf Coast Veterans Health Care System PGY1 pharmacy residency program is to build on Doctor of Pharmacy (Pharm.D.) education to contribute to the development of clinical pharmacy specialists responsible for medication-related care of patients with a wide range of conditions, eligible for board certification, and eligible for postgraduate year two (PGY2) pharmacy residency training or fellowship. The program prepares pharmacist clinicians to practice exceptional patient care in acute care and ambulatory care positions as well as deliver services that foster efficiency, safety, and costeffectiveness of medication use. Residents will be provided the opportunity to accelerate their growth beyond entry-level professional competence in patient-centered care, pharmacy operational services, and to further the development of leadership skills that can be applied to any practice setting.

The 12-month residency program at the Pensacola VA Clinic begins with residents rotating between block learning experiences including Home-Based Primary Care, Outpatient Pharmacy, and Adult Medicine/Internal Medicine (in Biloxi). The program then transitions residents into longitudinal experiences in Primary Care (Patient Aligned Care Team, PACT), Anticoagulation Clinic, and Pharmacy Administration. Residents advance their teaching skills by helping precept on-site pharmacy students and are also offered the opportunity to participate in a teaching certificate program through a neighboring College of Pharmacy.
