PGY1 Program Purpose: The AVAHCS PGY1 Pharmacy Residency program prepares pharmacists to be competent, compassionate, and independent practitioners providing direct patient care in diverse health care settings. They will be skilled in educating health care professionals, patients, and others regarding medication-related issues. They will perform professionally and with high personal standards in order to be an effective member of the health care team and be innovative in providing pharmaceutical care.

Per ASHP, PGY1 pharmacy residency programs build on Doctor of Pharmacy (Pharm.D.) education and outcomes to contribute to the development of clinical pharmacists responsible for medication-related care of patients with a wide range of conditions, eligible for board certification, and eligible for postgraduate year two (PGY2) pharmacy residency training.
