### **About the Program**

The Boise VA Medical Center offers an ASHP accredited PGY2 residency program in Ambulatory Care and accepts three residents each year.

#### **Program Description**

The Boise VA PGY2 Ambulatory Care Residency is designed to expose residents to a variety of outpatient settings within the VA system. The resident will be expected to develop effective collaboration with other healthcare professionals while practicing in various ambulatory clin-

ics. As the team pharmacist, they will obtain extensive hands-on experience with ambulatory care Veteran patients by providing comprehensive medication management for their primary care disease states.

Residents will continue to foster development of teaching, management, and leadership skills by giving various presentations, assisting in PGY1 resident and pharmacy student mentoring, providing direct patient care, and participating in quality improvement projects. Residents who successfully complete the program are prepared for advanced patient care or other specialized positions, as well as board certification.

### **Clinical Training Site**

The Boise VA Medical Center aspires to be a diverse and inclusive environment with a culture and curriculum that ensures every resident knows they belong and matter. The site is also a teaching site for medical residents, psychology interns, pharmacy students, nurse practitioner and registered nurse trainees.
