2. Eligible to obtain licensure in any state within 90 days of residency start date
3. Hold US Citizenship

## Pharmacy Department

### Fayetteville VA Medical Center (VAMC):

- 58 general medical, surgical and mental health inpatient beds
- 69 bed long-term care unit
- Numerous outpatient clinics
- Serves over 157,000 veterans of North and South Carolina
- Home to inpatient and outpatient pharmacy services
  - More than 4,000 prescriptions processed daily
  - Some prescriptions are filled in house while others are filled by a Consolidated Mail Outpatient Pharmacy (CMOP) in Charleston, South Carolina

## Residency Program

The PGY-1 Pharmacy Residency Program is housed within both the main hospital facility as well as the brand new, state-of-the-art Health Care Center (HCC) a short drive from the main campus. The HCC provides primary care, specialty care, day surgery, audiology, pharmacy and radiology services.
