

Located in Central North Carolina, Salisbury VAMC is a tertiary care facility affiliated with multiple Schools of Pharmacy including the University of North Carolina, Campbell University, Wingate University, University of Florida, University of South Carolina, and several others. Salisbury VAMC is also affiliated with Wake Forest University School of Medicine and the Virginia College of Osteopathic Medicine. It serves as a training site for students and residents in multiple disciplines, including: nursing, dentistry, optometry, pharmacy, psychiatry, rehabilitation, and medicine.

The medical center provides medical, surgical, psychiatric, and ambulatory care services to approximately 91,000 Veterans in the central Piedmont service area. It boasts large full-service Community-Based Outpatient Clinics (CBOCs) in Winston-Salem and Charlotte, NC. New Health Care Centers (HCCs) are slated to open in Kernersville and Charlotte in spring 2016. Hematology and chemotherapy treatments are also offered for Veterans at the Salisbury medical center infusion center.

Salisbury VAMC has clinical pharmacy specialists with prescribing privileges in primary care, long-term care, pain management, home-based primary care, mental health clinics, infectious disease, and acute care. The medical center also provides an in-house Community Leaving Center and hospice care for Veterans.
