Purpose

ASHP standard PGY2 Program Purpose: PGY2 pharmacy residency programs build on Doctor of Pharmacy (Pharm.D.) education and PGY1 pharmacy residency programs to contribute to the development of clinical pharmacists in specialized areas of practice. PGY2 residencies provide residents with opportunities to function independently as practitioners by conceptualizing and integrating accumulated experience and knowledge and incorporating both into the provision of patient care that improves medication therapy. Residents who successfully complete an accredited PGY2 pharmacy residency should possess competencies that qualify them for clinical pharmacist and/or faculty positions and position them to be eligible for attainment of board certification in the specialized practice area (when board certification for the practice area exists).

The PGY2 residency in Ambulatory Care pharmacy practice at the Lebanon VA Medical Center is focused on developing practitioners who will exhibit excellence in pharmaceutical care in Ambulatory Care practice settings. An Ambulatory Care Clinical Specialist should possess the clinical skills needed to practice in a wide range of patient care settings and a solid knowledge base in Ambulatory Care pharmacotherapy. This PGY2 residency will provide the environment necessary to achieve the knowledge and skills needed to care for patients in the Ambulatory Care area and obtain positions in a wide-range of job settings such as VA, private sector or as a Clinical Specialist in an integrated healthcare delivery system. The PGY2 residency will help prepare graduates of the program to achieve the clinical knowledge base needed to attain board certification in ambulatory care.

Program goals

Clinical development

- Provide patient-specific medication management services within an approved Scope of Practice which results in positive patient outcomes
- Develop strong patient care skills in chronic Ambulatory Care disease states
- Provide patient specific educational services on a one-to-one basis as well as in group meetings
- Become familiar with pharmacy benefit management principles including the non-formulary process
- Become established as an integral part of the health care team

Educational development

- Effectively evaluate and apply data from clinical trials into your pharmacy practice skills
- Develop skill set to effectively educate health care professionals in small discussions groups as well as during didactic type lectures
- Develop skills to provide competency based training to pharmacy employees including pharmacists and pharmacy technicians
- Develop skills needed to precept both Lebanon VA PGY1 Pharmacy Practice Residents and Pharm.D. student rotations.

Personal development

- Develop the skills necessary to effectively self evaluate one's work
- Develop written and verbal communication skills to successfully practice in Ambulatory Care clinics
- Demonstrate effective time- management skills needed to successfully practice as a Clinical Pharmacy Specialist

Application Requirements

The Lebanon Veterans Affairs Medical Center (VAMC) PGY2 Ambulatory Care Pharmacy Residency Program is open to any individual regardless of race, color, creed, religion, sex, age, or handicap. All applications materials should be submitted via the PhORCAS system by the application deadline and will be competitively considered for an interview.

The minimum requirements to receive consideration for an interview are as follows:

- Current enrollment in a n ASHP accredited PGY1 pharmacy residency program with anticipated completion prior to start of PGY2 residency or have previously completed an ASHP accredited PGY1 residency
- Must be licensed as a pharmacist in any US state or territory in compliance with our residency's licensure policy
- Possess a Doctor of Pharmacy degree from an ACPE-accredited school or college of pharmacy; or a B.S., M.S., or Ph.D. degree and equivalent experience
- Applicants must be able to commit to the residency for a period of no less than one year.
- Applicant must be a US citizen.

Please note that these are the minimum requirements to receive consideration for an onsite interview. Meeting these criteria does not guarantee acceptance.
