About CMCVAMC

Corporal Michael J. Crescenz Veterans Affairs Medical Center (CMCVAMC) in Philadelphia, Pennsylvania is a 360-bed tertiary care hospital affiliated with the University of Pennsylvania, University of the Sciences in Philadelphia, Jefferson College of Pharmacy, and Temple University School of Pharmacy. Program Purpose and Description

PGY1 pharmacy residency program builds on Doctor of Pharmacy (Pharm.D.) education and outcomes to contribute to the development of clinical pharmacists responsible for medication-related care of patients with a wide range of conditions, eligible for board certification, and eligible for PGY2 pharmacy residency training. The program will focus on the development of skills in a variety of practice settings including acute care, ambulatory care, administration, and formulary management. There is an optional opportunity to complete a teaching and learning certificate program through University of the Sciences in Philadelphia.
