This STVHCS PGY2 residency in Infectious Diseases has been ASHP-accredited since 1996 and is designed to provide a challenging training opportunity for individuals desiring to develop clinical competency in the specialized area of infectious diseases pharmacotherapy. The 12month training period incorporates both outpatient and inpatient rotations devoted to the development of skills essential for the delivery of pharmaceutical care with a primary focus on infectious diseases.


