

A VA RESIDENCY

The VA Maryland Health Care System at Baltimore is seeking three highly motivated Postgraduate Year 1 Residency Program candidates. The goal of this program is to develop a proficient provider of pharmaceutical care with excellent communication and administrative skills. Through flexibility and opportunity, this program fosters a unique residency experience.



The VA offers rotations in diverse practice areas through Inpatient, Ambulatory Care and Long Term Care programs. Core rotations for this program include: Internal Medicine, Cardiology, Critical Care, Practice Management, and Ambulatory Care. A wide array of elective rotations are available within the VA Maryland Health Care System as well as through affiliated institutions.

FLEXIBILITY

Teaching

The Postgraduate Year 1 Residency Program in collaboration with the University of Maryland School of Pharmacy offers numerous teaching experiences. The resident will receive a faculty appointment through the University of Maryland School of Pharmacy. Teaching opportunities include lecturing, leading small group discussions, conducting practice lab sessions and precepting Doctor of Pharmacy students.

Presentations

Formal presentations and journal club are conducted weekly in conjunction with other participating Baltimore residency programs. The resident is required to conduct a research project for presentation at the Eastern States Residency Conference and compose a manuscript of publishable quality.



Evaluation

Evaluations are performed quarterly by the program director and at the conclusion of each rotation in accordance with ASHP's Residency Learning System.

Qualifications

A Doctor of Pharmacy degree and U.S. citizenship are required for this residency program. Candidates must be eligible for licensure in any U.S. state.
