PGY-1 PHARMACY RESIDENCY PROGRAM

A VA RESIDENCY

The VA Maryland Health Care System (VAMHCS) is seeking **THREE** highly motivated Postgraduate Year 1 Residency Program candidates. This 12-month ASHP-accredited program is designed to train pharmacists in multiple areas of pharmaceutical care so that they are prepared to assume an advanced practice patient care position, adjunct faculty position or to pursue PGY2 training in a focused area of practice. This residency places emphasis on clinical and distributive pharmacy services, using a comprehensive, hands-on, clinically focused approach. Through flexibility and opportunity, this program fosters a unique residency experience, serving a challenging and rewarding veteran population.



FLEXIBILITY

The VAMHCS PGY1 program offers rotations in diverse practice areas including Acute Care, Ambulatory Care, and Long-term Care. Core rotations for this program include: Internal Medicine, Cardiology, Critical Care, Psychiatry, Practice Management, Hospital Pharmacy and Ambulatory Care. A variety of elective rotations are available within the VA Maryland Health Care System as well as through affiliated institutions. The VAMHCS is a multi-campus health system. Rotations will be held at multiple sites in the Baltimore-metro area.



OPPORTUNITY

Teaching

The Postgraduate Year 1 Residency Program in collaboration with the University of Maryland School of Pharmacy offers numerous teaching experiences. The resident will receive a faculty appointment through the University of Maryland of School of Pharmacy. Teaching opportunities include lecturing, leading small group discussions, conducting practice lab sessions and precepting Doctor of Pharmacy Students. In addition, there is an optional Teaching Certificate Program offered by the School of Pharmacy.
