## **Program Goals**

The VA Boston Healthcare System offers a one-year ASHP-accredited PGY-2 residency in Geriatric Pharmacy. The aim of our program is to provide robust geriatric training in various care settings. The resident will become proficient in the optimization of geriatric pharmacotherapy, medication reconciliation, deprescribing and intimately familiar with multi-disciplinary team assessment and management of the complex older adult patient.

The resident will receive comprehensive, intense, and individualized training in aspects of geriatrics from dedicated, passionate, and expert pharmacy & geriatric medicine faculty.

Geriatric Clinical Pharmacy Specialists work under a broad scope of practice in a collaborative practice environment to align medication therapy with patient/caregiver goals of care. The hallmark of this program is the exceptional <u>interprofessional team</u> that the resident works with routinely.
