VA Mental Health Pharmacy

- The Salt Lake City (SLC) VA PGY₂ Psychiatric Residency program is ASHP accredited and offers 3 resident positions.
- The SLCVA embraces the ideals of person-centered recovery-oriented mental health (MH) care.
- Our 12 mental health pharmacist preceptors (9 board-certified) are fully integrated members of the multidisciplinary teams responsible for supporting patients in their recovery process.
- The program is focused on training highly professional pharmacists that are patient-centered, results driven and proactive.
- Residents may apply for a scope of practice after completion of their first rotation.

The majority of the resident's experience will be spent with direct patient care responsibilities through the following rotations:

Core (4-6 weeks each)

- Inpatient Psychiatry Unit (IPU)
- Residential Substance Use Disorder (SUD)
- Outpatient SUD (one of the following)
 - Addiction Psychiatry
 - Primary Care Addiction Medicine
- Outpatient MH & Primary Care MH Integration
- Geriatric Primary Care & Psychiatry
- Transitions of Care

Elective (3-4 electives, 2-4 weeks each)

- MH Consult and Liaison
- Utah Poison Control Center
- Academic Detailing
- Child & Adolescent Psychiatry (through partnership with Primary Children's Hospital)
- Neurology (through partnership with University of Utah Health Care System)
- Other opportunities based on resident interest and preceptor availability

Longitudinal (weekly ½ day clinic, 3-5 months each)

- Outpatient MH/SUD pharmacist
- Outpatient MH provider (MD or NP)

Longitudinal Panel (5-10 patients, 9 months)

- Independently managed by resident with preceptor oversight
- Outpatient SUD/MH medication management

Rotations (continued)

Service Commitment (12 months)

- One weekend per month staffing on IPU
- Medication reconciliation
- 1-hour medication education group
