


The VA Puget Sound Health Care System (VAPSHCS) is a 421-bed acute care center that provides tertiary care for veterans in Western Washington. VAPSHCS consists of two main medical facilities community-based clinics. Services are also provided to veterans referred from Alaska, Eastern Washington, & Northern Idaho. The VA is affiliated with the University of Washington and has many allied health training programs (medicine, pharmacy, nursing, etc.). Pharmacy services include inpatient medicine, long-term care, critical care, emergency medicine, surgery, primary care, substance abuse, pain, mental health, endocrinology, oncology, spinal cord injury, and bone marrow transplant. VAPSHCS has one of the largest research programs in the VA.

- Large 1A tertiary care teaching hospital

How to Apply

Qualifications

- Standard applicant requirements:
 - United States citizenship
 - Completion of PGY1 pharmacy residency
 - Doctor of Pharmacy degree
 - Pharmacist licensure in any US state
 - Participation in interview process
 - Participation in the NMS Residency Matching Program

How to Apply

Applications are accepted through the Pharmacy Online Residency Centralized Application Service (PhORCAS) system.

Standard application should include:

- 1. Letter of intent
- 2. Curriculum vitae
- 3. Three letters of recommendation via PhORCAS
- ⇒ One must be from PGY1 residency program director
- ⇒ Two must be from the PGY1 residency site (such as preceptors or mentors)
