

## **Recommendations for Weight Management Medicines (WMM)**

- ➤ Your provider will review all the medicines you are taking.
- You need to participate in an approved weight management program that targets all three aspects of weight management:
  - 1. behavioral counseling
  - 2. nutrition
  - 3. physical activity

*MOVE!*<sup>®</sup> is the recommended VA weight management program.

Body-Mass Index (BMI) of 30 or greater



**BMI of 27 or greater** with at least one weight-related health concern such as:

- high blood pressure
- previous heart attack or stroke
- type 2 diabetes
- obstructive sleep apnea
- metabolic dysfunctionassociated steatotic liver disease (MASLD)
- high cholesterol
- osteoarthritis

## **Weight Loss Medication Chart**

Medicine	Projected Weight loss	Administration	Potential Monitoring	
Naltrexone/ bupropion (Contrave®)	<b>After 3 months,</b> weight loss should be <b>at least 5%</b> of your starting weight.	by mouth: 2 times a day	• weight	
Orlistat (Xenical®, Alli®)	<b>After 3 months,</b> weight loss should be <b>at least 3%</b> of your starting weight.	by mouth: 3 times a day	<ul><li>blood sugar</li><li>blood pressure</li></ul>	
Phentermine/ Topiramate (Qsymia®)	<b>After 3 months,</b> weight loss should be <b>at least 3%</b> of your starting weight.	by mouth: 1 time a day	<ul> <li>regular pregnancy tests if applicable (Phentermine/ Topiramate)</li> </ul>	
<b>Liraglutide</b> (Saxenda®)	After 4 months, weight loss should be at least 4% of your starting weight.  Injection under skin fold 1 time a day		<ul><li>heart rate</li><li>blood tests</li></ul>	
Semaglutide (Wegovy®)	<b>After 5 months,</b> weight loss should be <b>at least 5%</b> of your starting weight.	Injection under skin fold:	• mood	
<b>Tirzepatide</b> (Zepbound®)	<b>After 4 months,</b> weight loss should be <b>at least 5%</b> of your starting weight.	1 time a week		

If you are not losing weight, talk with your health care team. Participation in a comprehensive lifestyle intervention, like MOVE!®, is essential to weight management.

Phentermine/ Topiramate (Qsymia®)	<ul><li>constipation</li><li>headache</li><li>dizziness</li><li>changes in the way food tastes</li></ul>	<ul> <li>numbness/tingling in the hands, arms, feet or face</li> <li>dry mouth</li> <li>trouble sleeping</li> <li>feeling nervous</li> </ul>	<ul><li>confusion</li><li>higher blood pressure</li><li>fast heartbeat</li><li>muscle pain, cramps or weakness</li></ul>	<ul><li>allergic reaction*</li><li>mood changes</li></ul>
