

PGY1 pharmacy residency programs build on Pharm.D. education and outcomes to contribute to the development of clinical pharmacists responsible for medication-related care of patients with a wide range of conditions, eligible for board certification, and PGY2 pharmacy residencies.

Stipend/Benefits

- ◆ 2018 PGY1 stipend \$41,533
- ◆ 2018 PGY2 stipend \$45,435
- ◆ In addition, this VA program supports a Dual appointment, which allows residents, once licensed as pharmacists, to get paid as pharmacists while completing some of the staffing requirements.
- ◆ Benefits include 13 days of vacation, 10 paid federal holidays, sick leave, paid time off to attend state and national meetings, and a health care benefit package.

Application Process

- ◆ Application are submitted in PhORCAS: <https://portal.phorcas.org>
- ◆ Academic Requirements:
 - ◆ Graduate of accredited pharmacy school with a Doctor of Pharmacy degree
 - ◆ GPA \geq 3.0
 - ◆ No courses repeated more than one time
 - ◆ No significant, unexplained gaps in pharmacy training/practice
- ◆ U.S. citizenship is required
- ◆ PGY2 candidates must have completed or currently completing a PGY1 residency
- ◆ Applicants must be registered with the ASHP Matching Program
- ◆ On-site interview required
- ◆ Starting Date: June 24th, 2019
- ◆ Duration 1 year
