PGY1 PHARMACY PROGRAM DESCRIPTION

This progressive residency in Pharmacy Practice is designed to emphasize the development and training of a clinical practitioner who can improve drug therapy and excel in future professional endeavors. The resident will assess, design, recommend and monitor patient-specific pharmacotherapy in a variety of direct patient care settings. The resident will participate in the ongoing revision and development of a managed care health system with a primary care emphasis. Opportunities include the development of skills in utilizing health care systems that support an expanded view of pharmacy practice.

The resident will develop these skills through participation in rotations and electives including:

- ◆ Ambulatory Care
- ◆ Anticoagulation Services
- ◆ Community Living Center
- ◆ Emergency Medicine
- ◆ Geriatrics
- ◆ Home Based Primary Care
- ◆ ICU
- ◆ Infectious Disease

PGY1 RURAL HEALTH

The VASNHCS also offers a one-year ASHP accredited pharmacy practice residency (PGY1) with opportunities to experience Rural Health. The VASNHCS provides care to veterans over a large area, much of which is considered rural/highly rural. The majority of learning opportunities will occur at the Reno Campus in order to provide a well-rounded residency experience and for residents to learn how to coordinate care across the continuum of a health care system. Residents will also learn to provide patient-centered pharmacy services in a community based outpatient clinic (CBOC) setting. Our CBOCs offer primary care, specialty clinics, mental health, and health-informatics, among other services, for veterans in outlying geographical areas. A total of three months will be spent at a CBOC site.

ABOUT THE VA SIERRA NEVADA HCS

The VA Sierra Nevada Health Care System (VASNHCS) provides a wide array of inpatient and outpatient services in medicine, surgery, women's health, mental health, alcohol and drug treatment, interventional cardiology and radiology, neurology, as well as clinical pharmacy services. Our care extends beyond the Reno metropolitan area with community based outpatient clinics (CBOCs)/outreach clinics in Fallon, Minden, and Winnemucca, Nevada, as well as Susanville, California.

The Ioannis A. Lougaris Medical Center in Reno, Nevada is the primary facility where residents train. This 60 bed primary care hospital is affiliated with the University of Nevada Reno School of Medicine, the Idaho State University School of Pharmacy, and the Roseman University of Health Sciences. The medical center provides care to approximately 35,000 patients in Northern Nevada, Southern Oregon and Northeast California. There is also an on-site 60-bed long term skilled nursing facility.

The hospital is located minutes from Lake Tahoe, the Sierra Nevada mountains, and world-class skiing. Reno offers an ideal climate for outdoor activities, many entertainment opportunities, and the Bay Area, Napa Valley, and Yosemite are within a four-hour drive.

The progressive Pharmacy Service consists of 100+ full-time employees. Formal educational programs are offered for pharmacy residents and Pharm.D. students as well as residents and students from Internal Medicine, Family Practice, Surgery, Psychiatry, Psychology, Social Worker, and Nursing Programs.

Inpatient pharmacists are actively involved in rounds, patient drug therapy design, implementation, and monitoring, inpatient anticoagulation adjustment, pharmacokinetics, TPN formulation, antimicrobial stewardship, geriatrics, discharge counseling, drug information, DUE/ADR reporting, and many other patient care functions. Outpatient Pharmacy distribution is accomplished by state-of-the-art robotics. Clinical Pharmacy Specialists work collaboratively under an expanded scope of practice in many areas of the facility, such as Ambulatory Care, Mental Health, Specialty, Pain, Anticoagulation, Home Based Primary Care, Infectious Disease and Oncology. Pharmacy services is considered an integral part of VASNHCS.
