

SOUTH TEXAS VETERANS HEALTH CARE SYSTEM

South Texas Veterans Health Care System (STVHCS) is comprised of the Audie L. Murphy, Kerrville, and the satellite clinic divisions. The Audie L. Murphy Memorial Hospital is a 268-bed facility providing primary, secondary, and tertiary health care in medicine, surgery, mental health, and rehabilitation medicine. It also supports a 90-bed Community Living Center, 30-bed Spinal Cord Injury Center, 66-bed Domiciliary and Substance Abuse Residential Rehabilitation Treatment Program (SARRTP), and a Geriatric Research Education and Clinical Center. The San Antonio Polytrauma Rehabilitation Center is one of five facilities in the country designed to provide intensive rehabilitative care to Veterans and Service members who have experienced severe injuries.

STVHCS dedicates 28,000 square feet to medical research, and there are more than 150 research investigators conducting over 500 research activities. The system has a National Institutes of Health (NIH)-funded General Clinic Research Center and is a Cochrane Centre site.

Clinical Pharmacy is heavily involved in the care of veterans with over 70 clinical pharmacy specialists (CPS) covering a variety of areas. Currently, sixteen CPSs specialize in mental health and are embedded into primary care, general mental health, serious mental illness, inpatient psychiatry, and substance abuse teams.

APPLICATION PROCESS

Online applications, three letters of recommendation, and college transcripts must be received no later than December 31 through Pharmacy Online Residency Centralized Application Service (PhORCAS) <http://www.ashp.org/phorcas>.

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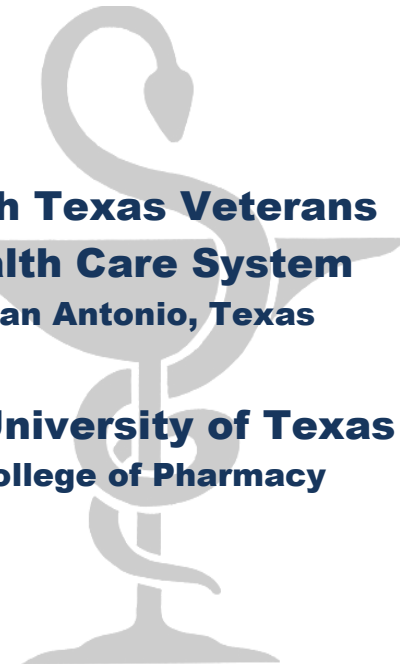

DESCRIPTION

The Psychiatric Pharmacy Residency Program at the STVHCS in conjunction with The University of Texas College of Pharmacy has been accredited by the American Society of Health-System Pharmacists since 2005. The program is designed to provide a challenging training opportunity for individuals desiring to develop clinical competency in the specialized area of psychiatric pharmacy. The 12-month training period incorporates outpatient, inpatient, and residential experiences devoted to the development of skills essential for the delivery of pharmaceutical care to patients with mental illness. This residency allows for ample teaching opportunities, both didactic and preceptorship, as well as offers a formal teaching certificate program. At the completion of this year-long training program, the resident is qualified for positions in clinical pharmacy and academia as clinical faculty.

The Psychiatric Pharmacy Residency is recruiting for two positions, and will have ten co-residents from PGY-1 and other PGY-2 programs.
