


PGY1 Pharmacy Residency Program

Sheridan's Historic Downtown



The Sheridan VAHCS is a mental health and primary care facility for men and women who served their country in the Armed Forces. In 1898 the grounds that are now the Sheridan VA Medical Center were set aside by President William McKinley as Fort McKenzie. In the 1920s, the fort transferred to the Bureau of Health as a hospital for men coming home from WWI with battle fatigue, or what is currently known as PTSD. Today the Sheridan VA has 208 beds and serves nearly 12,000 Veterans yearly. The Healthcare System boasts eight Community Based Outpatient Clinics, located strategically across Wyoming. Sheridan has several Residential Treatment Programs that address multiple aspects of psychiatric care, including substance abuse, PTSD, and co-occurring disorders.



Purpose:

Sheridan VAHCS's PGY1 pharmacy residency program builds on Doctor of Pharmacy (PharmD) education and outcomes to contribute to the development of clinical pharmacists responsible for medication-related care of patients with a wide range of conditions, eligible for board certification, and eligible for postgraduate year two (PGY2) pharmacy residency training. This unique program also offers the opportunity to work with Veterans from all parts of the country in our Mental Health programs.

Federal Employment:

- Applicants must meet requirements for federal employment, including a background check, a successful physical exam, and urine drug screen
- Residents are required to obtain a pharmacist's license in any state within 3 months of appointment
